# SHEEP

*Superintendent—Bart Marshall*

**Rules:**

- Entries Close—when pens are filled, but no later than August 31st, 2018.
- Entry Fee—\$2.00 per head and a one time Livestock Exhibitor Fee of \$3.00 must be sent with Entry Form.
- In Place—All animals must be in place by Sunday morning, September 23rd.
- Judging—Wednesday, September 26th at 9:00 a.m.
- Removal—No animals removed before 10:00 p.m. on closing day of Fair.
- The Society will furnish no hay or bedding for stock.
- The date for computing the age of sheep is September 1st, except for junior lambs which is January 1st.
- All sheep must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of making entry.
- No animals shall be entered for more than one Premium except in flocks.
- All sheep entered must be eligible to registry in a recognized flock book. Exhibitors must be prepared to furnish certificate of registry of all animals over 1 year of age and also certificate of transfer if not bred by exhibitor, if requested to do so by the Superintendent (Exception: Section 41).
- Wether Type Breeding Sheep are limited to entries in Section 41 only.
- All sheep/goats moved within Michigan shall be identified with official USDA Scrapie program identification tags prior to movement off the farm. Contact the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) at (866) 873-2824 for ear tags. Refer to MDARD Health Requirements for updated information.
  - USDA Official Ear Tag—tagged in either ear. OR
  - USDA Official Ear Tag number tattooed in the ear, flank, or tail web. If tattooed, the end of the Scrapie tag should be cut off so it can't be reused. The cut Scrapie tag must be carried with the goat whenever it is moved. OR
  - USDA approved breed association registry tattoo. The breed registration certificate, which include the tattoo characters, must accompany the goat when moved. USDA approved breed association include: the American Boer Goat Association, the American Dairy Goat Association, the American Goat Society, the Cashmere Goat Registry, the International Boer Goat Association, the International Fainting goat Association, the National Pygmy Goat Association, the Nigerian Dwarf Goat Association, the Pedigree International, and the Pygora Breeders Association. OR
  - Pygmy goats registered with the National Pygmy Goat Association (NPGA) can use the NPGA microchips. They must carry the NPGA registration certificate with the goat when moved. Owners using this ID are required to provide a microchip reader. OR
  - Sheep that are part of the USDA Scrapie Flock Certification Program can use the Scrapie Flock Certification Program tag. OR
  - Sheep that are part of the USDA Scrapie Flock Certification Program can tattoo the number from the USDA Scrapie Flock Certification Program tag in the ear or flank. If tattooed, the tag must be carried with the animal whenever it is moved.
- An exhibitor is not entitled to draw more than two moneys in any one Class and only one money in group Classes.

**Rules:**

- Entries Close—August 31st, 2018.
- Entry Fee—\$1.00 per Fleece. Limit 2 entries per class. Livestock Exhibitor Fee of \$3.00 will apply.
- In Place—Fleece Entries submitted Noon until 4:00 p.m., Saturday, September 22nd and 8:00 a.m. until Noon, Sunday, September 23rd.
- Judging—Wednesday, September 26th.
- Removal—The fleeces will be displayed in the Open Sheep barn for the duration of the Fair to be released Saturday 10:00 p.m. until Midnight and Sunday 7:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. Any fleeces left after 10:00 a.m. Sunday will be disposed of by Wool Show.

6. Fleeces shall be displayed individually in plastic bags and should be skirted and free of excessive tags, foreign material or badly damaged or discolored fiber. All fleeces should be labeled with breed, Ram or Ewe and Weight. Any fleeces offered for sale should be labeled as such with price noted. All fleeces must stay through entire week even if sold.
7. Judge of the Fleece show reserves the right to move fleeces into appropriate classes if so determined, disqualify fleeces, make awards to qualify fleeces only and/or combine or close classes in the case of insufficient numbers.
8. The intent of the Wool Fleece Show is to:
  - a. Demonstrate to the Public a very active segment of the Sheep Industry in Michigan.
  - b. Provide Education to sheep producers and the public on Wool properties to be selecting.
  - c. Opportunity for Sheep Producers to Showcase their Breeds' Fleeces.
  - d. Provide a great Educational display with some hands on and active demonstrations on Wool Fleeces.

# DEPARTMENT 7 GOATS

*Superintendent—Bart Marshall*

**Rules:**

1. Entries Close—When pens are filled, but no later than August 31st, 2018.
2. Entry Fee—\$2.00 per head and a one time Livestock Exhibitor Fee of \$3.00 must be sent with the Entry Form.
3. In Place—All goats must check-in on Sunday, September 23rd between 9:00 a.m. to Noon. Other arrangements must be approved by the Superintendent.
4. Judging—Friday, September 28th at 9:00 a.m.
5. Removal—Goats will not be released before 10:00 p.m. on closing day of the Fair.
6. The exhibitor must supply own feed and bedding.
7. No more than two goats may be entered in each class, under the same exhibitor.
8. If youth enter open classes, the open class fees must also be paid.
9. The exhibitor is responsible for keeping the exhibit area clean at all times.
10. Milk disposal is permitted in the Dairy Barn only. Further information will be available at check-in.
11. All goats must be the property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
12. Overcrowding will not be allowed.
13. Goats are to be free of horns or scurs longer than an inch, unless otherwise specified for that breed's standards.
14. All goats for exhibition must be free of symptoms of infectious/contagious disease. Any goat exhibiting symptoms will not be allowed to unload and must be removed from the grounds.
15. All goats are subject to inspection by the Superintendent(s) and/or Veterinarian.
16. Absolutely no drugs or medication are to be given to goats at the Fair without the Superintendent's permission.
17. A decision as to how many individuals or farms exhibiting shall be left in the hands of the Superintendent of the department and his or her decision shall be final.
18. There must be a minimum of 2 inches of wood shavings. Pens can be topped with a layer of straw.

19. Exhibitors must provide a water bucket that fits inside a box 11" x 11 1/2".
20. Payment of Premiums will be mailed to the Exhibitor. Refer to the Rules and Regulations in the beginning of the book.
21. All goats moved within Michigan or interstate shall be identified with official USDA Scrapie program identification prior to movement off the farm. For USDA Scrapie identification guidelines refer to rules in Sheep section, Open Class.

- Entry Fees are as follows: One time \$3.00 livestock fee and \$1.00 per bird. Birds will be fed and watered daily by Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent. Feed furnished by the Agricultural Society.
- In Place—Poultry Check-in times:  
Friday, September 21st, 6:00-10:00pm  
Saturday, September 22nd, 7:00-10:00pm  
Sunday, September 23rd, at noon
- Judging times are as follows:  
Pigeons: Sunday, September 23rd, at 9:00 a.m.  
Waterfowl: Sunday, September 23rd, at 10:00 a.m.  
ALL other Poultry: Sunday, September 23rd, at noon
- The current edition of the American Poultry Association Standard of Perfection will be used as the authority for all judging.
- Removal—will be between 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. closing day of the fair and on Sunday, day after fair, from 9:00 a.m. to Noon, otherwise Premium will be forfeited. Management will not be responsible for animals left after this time.
- This is a carry up show. Exhibitors must be present for judging and are responsible for bringing each of their entries to the judge for consideration. You will be directed by assigned personnel the day of the show when your entries are called.
- All Pigeons not seamless banded will be shown as old birds.
- ONLY animals exhibited will be allowed to be sold.
- The management reserves the right to determine whether an entry is worthy of exhibition.
- Cash Premiums will be given from the awards marked in the judge's records and not from the ribbons that may be attached to the cages.
- The fair reserves the right to limit the number of entries accepted to the number of cages available.
- The Show Management will use every precaution to safeguard all specimens against sickness or disease; however, the management will not be responsible for any specimens lost.

- All chickens and turkeys must show documentation of a negative Pullorum test in the previous 90 days or a valid NPPI number. Proof may be requested at any time.
