Rules:

1. Entries Close—Entry Forms must be in the Fair Office no later than Friday, August 31st, 2018.
2. Entry Fee—Still Exhibit Entry Fee, see page 11.
3. In Place—Exhibits (wine & beer) must be brought to the Grange Hall from Noon until 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 20th. No wine or beer will be accepted after this date. Contact Superintendent if you cannot make this date.
4. Judging—Saturday, September 22nd.
5. Removal—No exhibit removed before 10:00 p.m. on closing day of Fair. May be removed on Sunday the day after fair from 9:00 a.m. until Noon. The empty bottles can be picked up at the same time.

Wine Show

Rules:

1. Competition is open to all winemakers 21 years of age and older.
2. Wines may be made from grapes, other fruits, vegetables, grains or other suitable ingredients (Must be indicated on exhibitor's ticket.)
3. Ingredients may be fresh, canned, dried, concentrate, or otherwise preserved.
4. All wines in the division must be made by the exhibitor named.
5. The named exhibitor may enter only one entry in each class.
6. Two bottles with label will be required for each entry; one for taste judging and one for unopened display and label judging.
7. Bottles should have nearly straight sides and a top that can be removed without tools except for a corkscrew.
8. Exhibits should be submitted in smooth glass of approx. 26 oz. capacity and filled within 1" to 2" of the fully installed cork or cap.
9. Labels may be used on bottles to identify wine.
10. Awards- Ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd and Rosette for Best of Show
11. No commercial vitners accepted.
12. If you add honey to any wine, it needs to be entered into the Honey Mead category.

The following are acceptable types of wines to enter:

Dry White Wine from Grapes, Sweet White Wine from Grapes, Red Dry Wine from Grapes, Red Sweet Wine from Grapes, Rose Wine from Grapes, White/Rose Wine from Flower Petals, Red Dry Non-Grape Vegetable Wine
