- Entries Close—August 30, 2019.
- Entry Fee—Still Exhibit Entry Fees, see page 13.
- In Place—Exhibits must be brought in **Thursday, September 19th between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. NO PHOTOS WILL BE ALLOWED IN AFTER THIS DATE.** Contact the Superintendent if you can not make this date.
- Judging—Saturday, September 22nd. Photographs are judged by professional photographers who consider primarily the composition, sharpness, color quality and balance, creativity, originality and the overall skills required to cap-

ture various subjects on film.

- Removal—No exhibit removed before 10:00 p.m. on closing day of the Fair. Any exhibit removed before this time will forfeit premium moneys. Also open Sunday, the day after the Fair from 9:00 a.m. until Noon. Please plan to have someone pick them up during these times. Any unclaimed photos will be destroyed.
- No photo will be exhibited with photographer's signature or logo on the face of the photo.
- Exhibit open to amateur photographers only. An individual who receives money for their work or who makes a living with photography is not eligible to exhibit, nor is their work eligible for exhibit by others.
- An exhibitor may enter ONE photo in each class. A photo or edited version of the same image may not be shown in more than one class or section.
- Photos not entered in the proper class will be sent home.
- The management reserves the right to determine whether a photograph is worthy of exhibition.
- Cash premiums will be given from the awards marked in the judge's records and not from the ribbons that may be attached to the exhibit.
- Single photos must be 8" X 10" and mounted neatly and securely on mounting board not to exceed 12" x 14". A border of 2 inches per side is recommended for all photographs. No photographs will be displayed in frames of any kind. Photos are secured to walls with use of staples on each corner. Some staples penetrate mounting boards. Please be aware and choose mounting boards accordingly.
- Photo Essays must consist of 6 to 12 photographs mounted on a single 16" X 20" mounting board. Photos must be 3" x 5" or larger.
- EXHIBITOR TAGS: bring at time of entry and Superintendent will attach tag.
- Please enter only the items you are certain you will bring. Entering more than this puts an undue workload on office staff.
- Once a photo has been exhibited at the fair it may NOT be shown again any time in the future.
